RICK'S RAMBLINGS WHERE ARE WE?

There is a State of the Union, a State of the State, and a State of the County and City address each year. Governments have ways to communicate to keep people informed. These addresses are used by officials from the President to the Mayor of our City to state the condition of things and most importantly to share the direction our political leaders would like to take in their area of responsibility, and what they would like to see come to fruition for the betterment of the people. This is not unique to our political system.

Our churches do it as well. After Paul would finish one of his missions, that is after visiting or establishing new churches, he would return to Antioch to report to the home church about the state of these new followers and the growth in faith and numbers they had made. "From Attalia they sailed back to Antioch, where they had been committed to the grace of God for the work they had now completed. On arriving there, they gathered the church together and reported all that God had done through them and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles." (Acts 14:26-27)

The United Methodist Church has such accountings as well. Our Annual Conference takes place every June. Our General Conference brings together the United Methodist Church worldwide every four years. Even in our local church we have a Charge or All Church Conference every year, usually in November. We look back at the year, to celebrate where we have served God and look forward to where God is leading us and we put in place our new leaders. This is an overview mostly in a statistical format, an accounting of where we are as a church. But I want to view the ministry in a programmatic way and see where we are and where God is directing and leading us.

Rick's Ramblings continued

Last year a number of people participated in studying and reading the *Twelve Keys to an Effective Church, Strong Healthy Congregations Living in the Grace of God.* This was a time when we sought to identify our present strengths and areas where we could develop and then grow ministries, planting seeds for future opportunities to become a strong and vital congregation. In May we came together for a morning Mission Visioning Retreat to identify current strengths and how to expand them, as well as new strengths we would like to grow.

Among the strengths we identified were our facilities, parking, and landscaping. These are not seen as people ministries., but we recognized that they are the gateway through which people get to view our facility. They are our first contacts with visitors and users of our facility. Plans are underway to open up the visibility of the property by cutting away the shrubs that line our parking lot on Margarita, so passersby can see our property and to provide more security for the Park and Ride vehicles. Also the landscaping has been improved by converting sections of our property (corner of Margarita and Rancho Vista, behind the building to the Prayer and Meditation Garden, and outside the Worship Center) to drought tolerant landscaping. One item we considered was another monument sign at the driveway to help identify the entrance, which can be difficult to see with its location on busy Margarita Road. The Trustees found that City Ordinance allows only one such permanent sign facing each street per business. We already have one. But with the help of Welcome and Outreach we have obtained two Welcome flutter flags that are put out for every worship service and special events at the church. The Trustees have other projects on the table not only to keep up our facility but also to upgrade it with an accessible ramp to the altar stage. All this is to make our property more accessible, inviting, and welcoming.

Another of our identified objectives is to have a music revival program to enhance and offer various worship experiences. The Worship Team will take this on as one of their major emphasis and will set goals for the coming year. This will Continued next column

support me in how we can continue to offer a vibrant, uplifting, and awesome worship experience in praise and for evangelism. In regard to the music revival, the Team has selected *His Voice*, a male choir, to share their musical gifts as a way to share the Gospel. They have performed concerts at TUMC before. We have set Pentecost, May 15, 2016, as the date to hold this event for the community.

A third program objective to grow stronger is our outreach through Vacation Bible School to try and touch as many children in our community as possible. Last summer we partnered with Hope Lutheran Church, and it was a wonderful blessing to share our ministry with another part of the Body of Christ. We look to partner with them again this summer and increase our reach with children and their families in the community.

Along with these program objectives that we have identified to grow our strengths in ministry we continue to reach out through missions such as providing meals for the homeless in our community, supporting the food pantry at St. Catherine's with gifts of food and the Golf Tournament, visiting the homebound and sick, supporting families who are in need in our church and community, strengthening our children and youth ministry programs, and offering more study and fellowship opportunities for the participation of new and longtime members of the church family.

If you have an idea for a ministry or program, be it one time, short term or other, feel free to share it with our Church Council chaired by Toby Hammett. You will find others who would have fun joining you and bring it to fruition. It will be the task of the Church Council, with the help of the various ministry teams, committees, task forces, and ad hoc groups, to help facilitate and support our Mission Vision and programs.
