I See A New Church

Isaiah 43:15-21

"Forget the former things; See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. The wild animals honor me, the jackals and the owls, because I provide water in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland, to give drink to my people, my chosen, the people I formed for myself that they may proclaim my praise."

Bishop Hagiya began his opening address with this: "If we haven't done anything really uncomfortable, not just a little uncomfortable but really uncomfortable, we probably aren't pushing ourselves far enough."

Over the last several months there has been debate, decisions made, and a ruling on those decisions on how the United Methodist Church will minister and embrace the LBGTQIA people and community. I've shared this in previous writings and messages. Many United Methodist Conferences, jurisdictions, churches and people in the United States and Europe cannot agree with the rulings and voted upon, to uphold the Traditional view of dealing with the Homosexual + community and clergy. They have made decisions to resist and not abide by that portion of the Book of Discipline and the ruling of the General Conference.

There are still many conversations and gatherings of United Methodists at all levels as to how we will live out the Gospel and to be faithful first to the way of Christ and the Church.

There are many in our congregation that have asked where we stand. What is our response? How will we move forward to fully live out "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors"?

I believe that for us to grow as a healthy congregation, we need to move together as a family of God to do really uncomfortable things in faith. This means that we might welcome ALL, and care for ALL of God's creation.


