Rick's Ramblings

Really Hectic

The opening line of the Christmas Carol, *O Little Town of Bethlehem* reads in part "O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie..." In reality when Mary and Joseph arrived in Bethlehem at the time of the census in which they were ordered to take part in by the Roman government, this "little" town was jam pack, hectic and crazy. In all this craziness there probably wasn't any room to get around the town and, as we read in the *Gospel of Luke*, there wasn't any place to lay your head. Any private home or any public establishment for that matter that could provide lodging was crammed full.

We know from the story that Mary and Joseph were late and couldn't find a place to prepare as Mary was due any time with their first child. And, reading between the lines, we sense they were led to the barn (in reality more like a cave) by a compassionate innkeeper. Making do with their accommodations, the young couple got ready for the birth of God's Son.

In the midst of hectic life God broke into the world with the birth of his son, the child of peace and hope, the child of love and grace.

Jesus was not born in a palace amidst hoopla and circumstance. Jesus wasn't born among the rich and powerful, a child of privilege. Jesus didn't make the headlines or leading story (yet). Jesus was born in the midst of the census, an occupying government, and a desperate people. Only lowly Shepherds outside of town, with the invitation of Angels, took any notice of this tiny baby.



Over two thousand years from the birth which was hardly noticed, we continue to celebrate the

Birth of God's son in the midst of struggles and desperation. With at least 20% of yearly sales on the line, retail stores begin their Christmas push almost before Halloween has finished that night. We hear the news of ISIS the terrorist group growing in strength and violence in the Middle East, news of the violence in the homes of our communities, the fear of dealing with a life threatening disease and getting older, tuition growing higher and more. All this is tugging for our attention.

Now as we get closer to Christmas, we want to "get into the spirit." So we break out the Christmas decorations, bake the cookies, go shopping (at the malls or on line) on "Black Friday", go to parties and Christmas gatherings. We create our own hectic life.

So where do we find Jesus in all of this? Do you just stop doing, tell everyone you are scaling back on shopping, not going to parties, and give up on family and church traditions? Actually friends,

I'm not advocating a checking out of celebrating Christmas (though I do get frustrated with rushing to Christmas). What I am inviting us to do is take time to prepare for Christ. Advent is the season that leads up to Christmas. It is the Latin word for prepare. Christ didn't just drop into humanity's lap. God did prepare His children for the Messiah. Advent is a time to use for devotion and reading the

Scriptures about the coming Messiah (Savior), to participate in those activities and services that offer joy, care, and love. If baking cookies brings joy to others, then do it and maybe add by taking a few dozen to a senior home or shelter. If putting up decorations brings a smile to you, do it and then maybe help others who can't decorate for themselves and bring a smile to their lives. If you enjoy buying gifts for family and friends, then do it and buy an extra gift for children who wouldn't know the joy of receiving a gift if not for your care.



Friends, the hectic life continues, but I am inviting you to make room for Jesus. I know you will find more joy for your life, more hope for yourself and the world, more peace in you and our communities as we come to the manger and bow before God's son, our Savior.

- ...after the gavel goes down, the handcuffs go on, and your loved one is led away.
- ...after the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible.
- ...after you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.
-after your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are the "After People." They are ready to come alongside you—or your friends, neighbors, coworkers, or relatives—and provide comfort and support for as long after as needed.


